The Calgary Police Service, in an effort to earn the trust and confidence of the Indigenous communities in and around the Calgary area, has developed the Indigenous Junior Police Academy. This program aims to remove barriers for Indigenous youth who are curious about a career in policing. The Indigenous Junior Police Academy offers a culturally sensitive space for those who self-identify as First Nation, Métis, or, Inuit to participate in the Junior Police Academy.

Those who do not identify as First Nations, Métis, or Inuit are not eligible to participate in the Indigenous Junior Police Academy but can apply for the Calgary Police Service's Junior Police Academy that is open to the general public.

Those who identify as Indigenous can apply for both the Indigenous Junior Police Academy and the Junior Police Academy that is open to the general public.
