Quick Tips for Making Your Patio Winter Ready

Design and Planning Ideas

Aesthetics

- Create a theme.
- Outdoor music speakers, DJs, guided craft stations, sport (i.e., shuffleboard, curling, crokicurl), tabletop games/sports (i.e., gaming clubs), immersive experiences, patio tour with passport, snowman building (even if Styrofoam), encouraging patio theming to make them a destination and passport opportunity.
- Offer family friendly programming during the day (i.e., artist workshops).
- Colour, colour, and a bit more colour maybe some sparkles, too!

Capture the Sun

- Orient your patio to get as much direct sun as possible.
- Shaded? Then reflect light into your space! That can be just as warming.
- Moveable furnishings allow people to orient themselves as they need.

Shelter (especially from the wind and downdrafts)

- Awnings.
- Curtains.
- Decorative evergreens.
- Louvres.
- Moveable screens.
- See-through panels.
- Note: Glass panels are not recommended particularly downtown.

Snow Removal and Storage

- Plan for what to do during and after a big snowfall.
- Can you use it or store it somewhere that people can create with it?

Lights and Music

- Colour changing LED lights are fun and can be changed to match your aesthetic each night.
- Music lets those passing by know you are open and having fun!
- LED candles and lanterns.
- · Surfaces with reflective paint.
- Garland.

Warming the Body

- Blankets and pillows (fleecy and colourful, of course).
- Winter appropriate furniture (i.e., tables, chairs, benches, couches, waterproof coverings – if not waterproof already, baskets for blankets).
- Space warming elements (i.e., heaters, fire tables, fireplaces, fire pits).
- Patron comforts (i.e., cushions, blankets, tablecloths).

Warming the Spirit

- Comfort foods like stews, chilis, curries, and casseroles. Don't forget the hot desserts!
- Craft hot drinks or warm cocktails.
- Prewarm dishes to help the food stay warm longer.
