When do I vote?

Who can vote?

You are eligible to vote if on By-election Day you:

- a. Are at least 18 years old.
- b. Are a Canadian citizen.
- c. Are a resident of Ward 4, 7, 11 or 12.

- d. Declare that you are of the same faith as the Calgary Catholic School District.
- e. Provide one of the authorized pieces of identification listed on page 4.

Voter Checklist Confirm that you are eligible to vote. Get informed – find out who is running in your ward for Calgary Catholic School District trustee. Make a vote plan – look up your voting opportunities and decide when and where to vote. Make sure you have one of the acceptable forms of ID with your name and current address on it.

What is the role of a school trustee?

Trustees act as advocates to ensure students receive the best possible faith-filled educational opportunities. Trustees must be prepared to put the needs of students first. They must also be willing to act in the best interest of all district schools and students and not focus their efforts on a particular issue or school.

As elected officials, trustees are accountable to the community and responsible for overseeing and directing the school district's operations. They are communicators, policy makers, role models and politicians. Their duties include: setting priorities for the school system based on available resources, adopting an annual budget, developing policies to guide administration and advocating to ensure education remains a public priority.

Catholic school trustees also play an integral role as advocates for Catholic education by ensuring students receive an education permeated by Catholic faith. As an Alberta Catholic school district, the Board of Trustees is accountable to both the Bishop of Calgary and Minister of Education.



At the voting station

Identification requirements

In order to vote you must bring one of the following:

One piece of identification (ID) issued by a Canadian government (federal, provincial or local), or an agency of that government, that contains your photograph, name and address, including but not limited to:



- Alberta Driver's Licence;
- Alberta Identification Card;

One piece of ID with your name and current address from the list below.

Government-issued documents

- Government cheque or cheque stub.
- Income/property tax assessment notice.
- Statement of government benefits (e.g., employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support or child tax benefit).

Other documents

- Bank/credit card statement or personal cheque.
- Insurance policy or coverage card.
- Letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee.
- Pension Plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation.
- Residential lease or mortgage statement.
- Utility bill (e.g., telephone, public utilities commission, television, electric, gas or water).
- Correspondence from a school, college or university.
- Any other identification authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer that contains your name and address.

Attestation

A letter or form (attestation) confirming that you live at the stated address will also be accepted as valid proof. The letter can be signed prior to the vote by an authorized representative of any of the following:

commercial property management company, correctional institution, postsecondary institution, shelter for the homeless, or supportive living or treatment centre.

Vouching

A person (e.g. a roommate, neighbour or family member) may vouch for and validate your identity and address if the person vouching is voting at the same designated voting station, and can provide one of the acceptable forms of ID. The person vouching may only do this for one household (maximum) and may not do so if they were vouched for themselves.

1. Confirm who you are and get your ballot

Show your ID and sign your voter statement.

2. Mark your ballot

 Go behind the privacy booth and mark your choice for separate school trustee.



3. Bring your ballot to the election worker

The ballot is placed in the secure ballot box.

What is my voter statement?

Before you vote you must sign a statement stating you are eligible to vote. Check your voter eligibility on page 1.



What if I need help voting?

- Magnifiers and large-grip pencils are available in voting stations upon request.
- Have a family member/friend, or an election worker assist in marking vour ballot.
- Language translation will also be available at many locations. You can also bring someone to translate for you.




