



Calls for Downtown Safety Response




Calgary Fire Overdose Response

Indigenous Youth Transfer Camps

Indigenous youth go onto the land with Elders and knowledge keepers to partake in intensive cultural Rites of Passage, typically called transfer ceremonies. These ceremonies often come with a commitment and support to 'live a good life', including commitments to avoid drug and alcohol use, gang involvement and crime.



2023 Outcome Data

89% of youth learned a new skill and 83% were positive and hopeful about their future as Indigenous individuals.

Preparations for Summer Heat: Tips for how to prepare for and stay safe during extreme heat is available now on <u>calgary.ca/heat</u>. A map of 31 publicly accessible locations where Calgarians can cool down is also available.





Coordinated Community Extreme Weather Response: The Calgary Homeless Foundation's infographic on last winter's collective community effort to provide safe shelter to those experiencing homelessness is now available at <u>calgaryhomeless.com</u>. The response saw:

- 6 warming centres serve 2,296 visitors
- 1,296 individuals transported to safe shelter
- 25 outreach teams distribute 203,581 essential items
